 - Mrs Wright gave details of those involved in the Neighbourhood Watch scheme and asked for support from Council for a meeting to be held on July 28th. This was agreed. Cllr PB is trying to get an enforcement order for Sheepcot carried out. Cllr JK announced that work should begin on the Flore by-pass in October.
- To confirm and sign minutes of the meeting held on 1st June 2015. Resolved. Minutes were accepted as a true 5. record. Chairman duly signed minutes and agenda.
