- To Receive Apologies and Approve Reasons for Absence. L Dilkes. Apologies accepted by Council. Cllr J Kirkbride. NCC. Cllr D Harries SNC, Cllr P Bignell SNC
- To Invite Declarations of Interest. None
- Register Of Interests Update. None
- **Public Participation.** Mrs Reeves informed Council that the WI had initiated a litter pick for the evening of May 5th, and asked for assistance with regard to bags, pickers, high vis jackets etc. Clerk to make enquiries with SNC. Vernon Ilott informed Council that the Bugbrooke surgery would no longer accept telephone request or repeat prescriptions, and asked Council for assistance or suggestions. The pharmacy apparently deliver medicines to the hairdressers on a weekly basis, and it was felt that the best option might be that prescription repeat forms could be left there for pick up at the same time the medicines were dropped.

- MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES; Not covered by the Agenda. Clerk reported that Highways had sent quotes to SNH for the installation of 4 parking places on the Pound at a cost of some £28,000.
- **REPORTS** 1. Light 26 on Weedon Rd repaired. Clerk to distribute Aylesbury mains details as soon as known.
 - 2. Roads and pavements. Roads were felt to be in generally poor condition. Clerk had reported multiple potholes on Watery lane and Middle St. some would be repaired, some did not meet intervention criteria. Potholes on Pound to be reported.
 - 3. The Green and Play Area. No problems at present.
 - 4. Playing Fields. No report.
 - 5. Trees. No problems.
 - 6. Allotments. More rents had been paid. 3 plots had been let to Stowe residents, it was wondered whether vacancies should advertised elsewhere. SC suggested a sliding scale of payments could be introduced for applicants taking on plots later in the year.

- Playing Field land purchase. Mr Thorneycroft had obtained grants for the piece of land adjacent to the Playing Fields available from NCC. The Parish Council will purchase the land and be owners of it, and the PFA will administer it in the same way that they do the existing Playing Field which Council bought in 1981. The land comprises 2.35 acres, sufficient for a junior football pitch, which the Bliss School can use. There will be restrictions on use and resale. Clerk to check whether NHB money would be needed for this purchase.
- SNH Land transfer The documentation that had been received was erroneous, and corrected documentation was awaited.
- Village Development and Neighbourhood Plan. SC reported that the NP would be a long term project, but that an action team to to combat a possible appeal by Gladmans against refusal of their application for 95 houses off Weedon Rd
- Review of the Internal Audit. Resolved. Review of the Internal Audit adopted by Council.
- Risk Assessments. Resolved. Health and Safety and Financial Risk assessments adopted by Council. Clerk stressed that Review of the Internal Audit Risk assessments could re-evaluated at any time.
