- 1 To Receive Apologies and Approve Reasons for Absence. AM Collins working Resolved to accept apologies.
- 2 Invite Declarations of Interest. NH re Sand bin.
- 3 Register of Interests Update. None.
- **Reports from the District and County Councillors.** Cllr AB reported that scrutiny of NCC budget was nearly complete, and that progress towards the Unitaries would soon be resumed. He expressed concerns about the development site opposite Clark's Garage on the A5. Planning conditions were not being adhered to and he felt that Daventry Council were being very lax as regards enforcement.
